COMMANDER'S MESSAGE

Well, we've gotten through the month of January. Or was it June? This weather is really interesting. I hope we don't have to pay for it later. I mean, washing your car outside this time of the year. Probably will have a heavy frost on Memorial Day!!

At the General Membership meeting on the 23rd of January, the chairman of the Constitution and By-Laws committee read proposed changes to our Constitution and By-Laws. These changes must then be sent to all members (they are elsewhere in this Newsletter) and will be discussed at the General Membership in February (the 27th) and voted on by all members present. A majority vote of those present is required for approval/disapproval. Please review these changes and come to the meeting to vote on your choice.

We (The American Legion Department of Maryland) are supporting 3 bills in the State Legislature this year. They are 1) allowing slot machines in Veterans Organizations through the State Lottery, 2) Granting an additional reduction of state income tax of \$5000.00 for military retirees and 3) Renewal of the legislation allowing state tax free status to Veterans Service Organizations. There will be meetings in the House and Senate by the applicable committees to discuss these bills. The first of these will be on Wednesday, February 1 at 3:00 in Annapolis. Numbers are important to the committee members. A large showing of VSO members, including Legionnaires is needed to be present. Please try to get to the meetings to help show our support. Wear your cap or hat or anything showing your Legion or VFW or DAV or any other VSO membership. Park at the Naval Academy Football Stadium and take the shuttle bus into town.

Remember that at the General Membership meeting in March we will have the first call for nominations for new Post officers and executive committee members. If you are interested in running for any office, please let me know. I will be appointing a nominating committee in the

next few days and will let them know of your desires. There will be a second and final call at the April meeting. The election will take place on May 28.

Finally, check the calendar for upcoming activities. Don't forget about Saint Patrick's Day on the 17th of March. We also have some Legion official functions coming up that anyone can attend. Please check the calendar or come to the Post Meeting on the 27th. Also don't forget that Diane has been putting together some delicious lunches on Thursdays. Call the Post on Wednesdays and check the menu for Thursday. Also, don't forget Shrimp night on Wednesday and BINGO on Friday. Stop by and have some fun.

Proposed Changes to Constitution and By-Laws To be voted on at the

February 27, 2012 Meeting

The wording with a strikethrough will be deleted and wording in parenthesis will be added

CONSTITUTION ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The administrative affairs of this Post of The American Legion shall, except as otherwise provided by the By-Laws, be under the supervision of an Executive Committee which shall consist of one member for every 200 (300) members of the Post not to exceed ~~six (6)~~ four (4), in addition to the officers of the Post. The term of office of the members of the Executive Committee shall be for one year. The Post, by its By-Laws, may provide for such other standing committees as the business of the organization may require.

SECTION 2. The officers of this Post shall be a Commander, First Vice Commander, Second Vice Commander, Third Vice Commander, Finance Officer, Assistant Finance Officer, Historian, Chaplain, Service Officer, Judge Advocate, Sergeant Major, Sergeant -At-Arms, Adjutant, Assistant Adjutant, and such other officers as may be deemed necessary by this organization

BY-LAWS ARTICLE II - MANAGEMENT

SECTION 2. The Executive Committee shall consist of one member for every 200 (300) members of the Post to be known as Executive Committeemen, the Immediate Past Commander, Commander, First, Second, and Third Vice Commanders, Finance Officer, Assistant Finance Officer, Judge Advocate, Service Officer, Historian, Chaplain, ~~Sergeant Major~~, Sergeant-At-Arms, Adjutant, and Assistant Adjutant.

ARTICLE 111 -DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 10. Duties of the Sergeant Major (At-Arms). The duties of the Sergeant Major (At-Arms) shall be to preserve order at all meetings and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Post (Commander and the) Executive Committee.

~~**SECTION 11.** Duties of the Sergeant -At-Arms. The duties of the Sergeant-At Arms are to assist in the performance of all duties of the Sergeant Major.~~

All sections of the Constitution and By-Laws will be renumbered accordingly.
